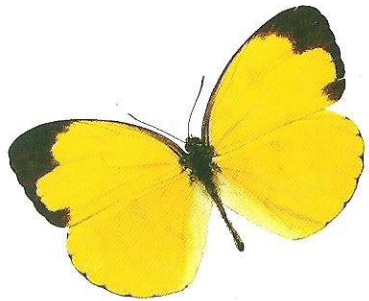
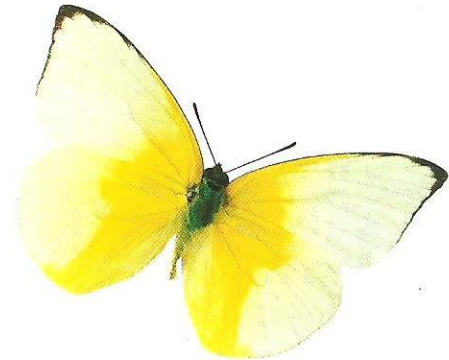


Walking through the pages of this book, curious young readers will discover nature's many colors.
